#### Teen ID post access policy

Fort Leonard Wood's Directorate of Emergency Services has policies on checking teenager Department of Defense ID cards at installation access points. If a child is with a parent or guardian, then no ID is required unless the child looks close in appearance to an adult or if the child is driving. Additionally, DOD ID card holders under the age of 18 are not authorized to sponsor non-DOD personnel on post. # LEONARD WOOD JUSTICE

#### **Courts Martial**

— On June 30, at a special courts martial at the Maneuver Support Center of Excellence and Fort Leonard Wood, a specialist pleaded guilty to two specifications of child endangerment. The military judge sentenced the specialist to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 140 days, and to be given a bad conduct discharge.

— On June 29, at a general court martial at the Maneuver Support Center of Excellence and Fort Leonard Wood, a panel consisting of officer and enlisted members found a specialist guilty, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault and one specification of abusive sexual contact. The military judge sentenced the specialist to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 12 months, and to be dishonorably discharged.

Federal Magistrate Court

— On June 28, there were 27 guilty pleas before a federal magistrate judge for traffic and other offenses on Fort Leonard Wood, resulting in fines ranging from \$130 to \$750.

NOTE: Soldiers administratively separated receive one of three characterizations of service: Honorable, General, or Other Than Honorable. Anything less than Honorable may result in the loss of certain benefits and negatively impact employment and education opportunities.
