Proponent Vision: Military Police (MP) officers are professional warrior police who are the Army's experts at combat policing, promoting the rule of law, and preserving the force both at home and abroad, across the range of military operations with a focus on readiness for protection, large-scale combat operations, and multi-domain operations. MP officers are talented leaders of character who must deal with complexity in both garrison and deployed environments, applying investigative skills, adaptive thinking, and a detail-focused approach to their interdisciplinary career field. MP officers must possess high levels of physical and mental stamina to operate under stress while skilled at establishing the necessary relationships in order to facilitate instruction, training, and education across the various cross-cultural, ethnic, and human dimensional attitudes. They are able to combine the art of command and the science of control to understand situations, make decisions, direct action, and accomplish missions regardless of operational constraints and environmental conditions.
